AEROSPACE CLUB - The Aerospace Club provides a fun and exciting way to learn the principles of flight and space exploration while constructing and launching model rockets and drones. It's a BLAST! Club meets 1-2x monthly. Application required to join this club. Limited to 20 participants. Open to all grade levels. Sponsors – Mrs. Lyons, Mrs. Sellers

AMBASSADORS – Ambassadors serve as school leaders who help new students adjust to their new school environment. They befriend newcomers, give school tours, and assist with spring orientation. Ten students will be selected per grade level through an application process at the beginning of the school year. Sponsors – Ms. Mercer, Ms. Reich

ROBOTICS TEAMS - The FIRST Tech Challenge requires students to develop strategies and build robots based on sound engineering principles, then compete in an alliance format against other teams. Students must be in grades 7/8 to apply and have previous FLL/VEX experience. In the VEX Robotics Competition teams of students are tasked with designing and building a robot to play against other teams in a game-based engineering challenge. SCIENCE CLUB - The Science Club will have speakers, experiments and activities for students who love SCIENCE! Teams of five compete and each school can send two teams. Students study and practice in the fall in preparation for regional competition in February and possibly national competition in April. SPEECH AND FORENSICS CLUB – Speech and Forensics is a competitive academic organization where participants will acquire skills of critical and independent thinking, research, organization of ideas and thoughts, oral communications, public speaking, active listening, and self confidence, just to name a few!
